Why?



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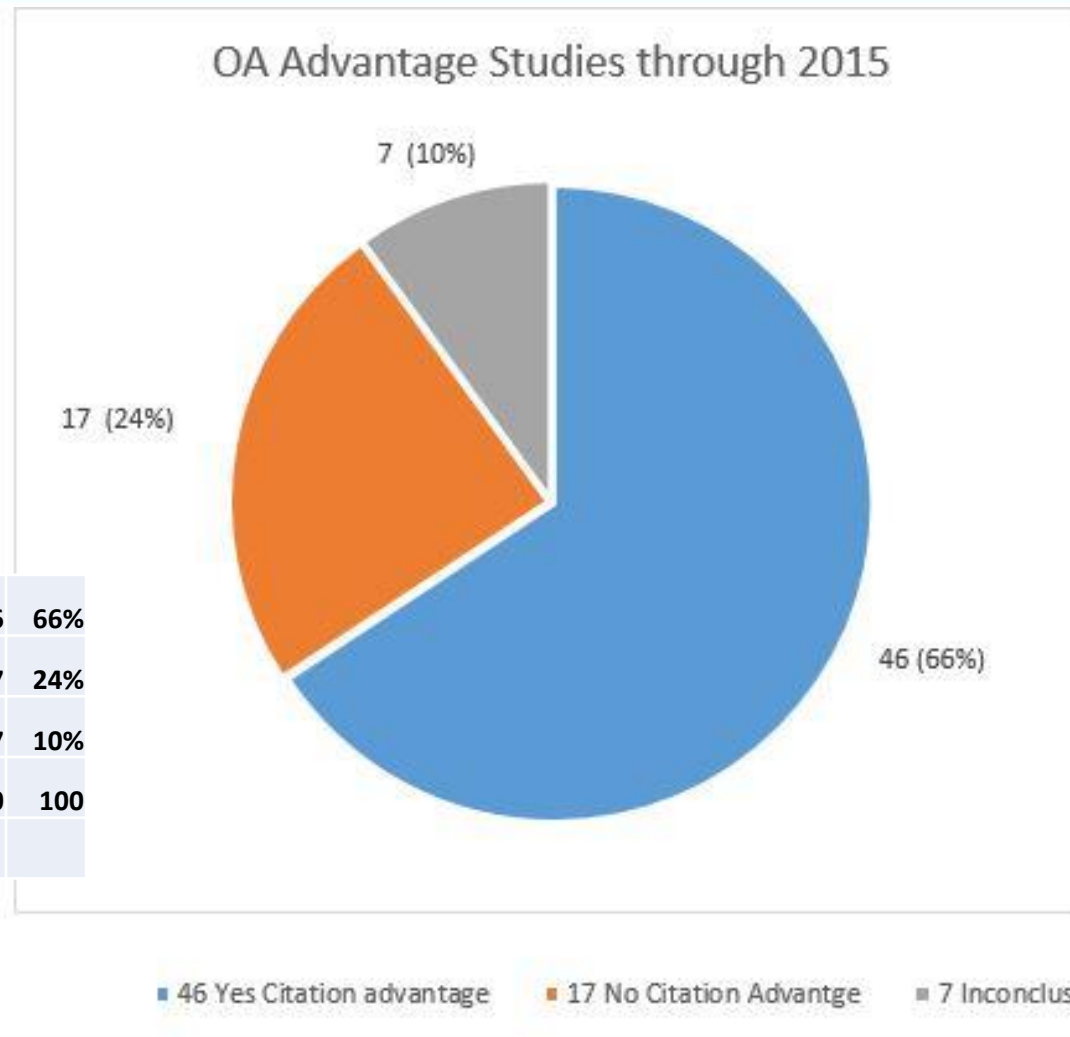
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Benefits

- Open Access publishing:
 - enables wider access to scholarly work
 - increases author citations
 - strengthens the college's institutional reputation
- Brockport first implemented an Open Access Policy for Journal Articles in 2018.



Higher Citation Rates for OA



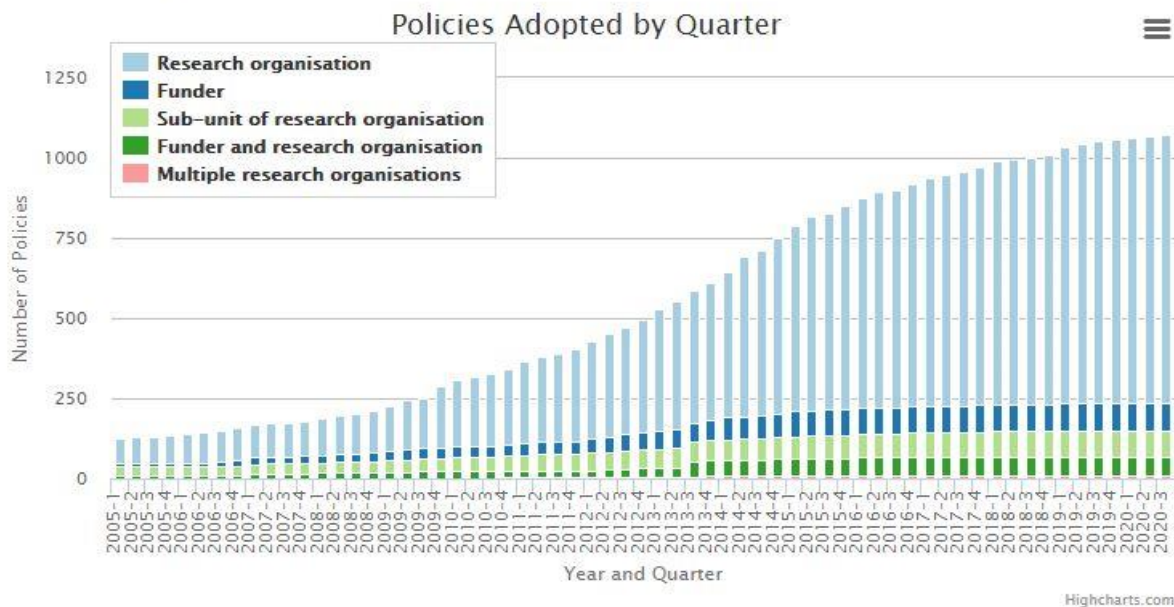

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How?

- Process

- Author completes manuscript, receives peer-reviews and makes edits
- Article is approved for publication
- Author submits article preprint, journal title, etc. to Digital Commons webpage for their dept.
- Library checks for journal permission, embargoes, etc. and posts appropriate version
